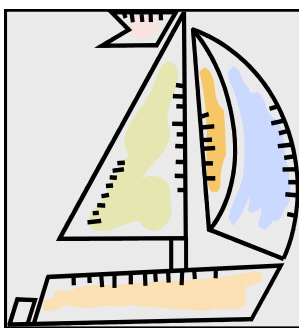

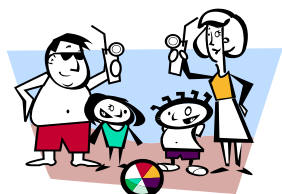

May Garden Guide

Flowers:

- Try Lantana, Cosmos, Vinca, Moss Rose & Copper Plant. They perform well with little care.
- For June blooming Agapanthus, fertilize & water now.
- Follow Amaryllis bloom cycle with fertilizer.
- Louisiana Irises require fertilizing & mulching for best performance.
- Prune climbing roses after bloom cycle is completed.
- Check for spider mites and white flies on Hibiscus. Early treatment will protect against infestation.

Vegetables:

- Watch tomatoes for blossom-end rot. Remove affected fruit. Maintain uniform soil moisture by mulching

Trees, lawn and Shrubs:

- Fertilize Azaleas for the second time, 4-6 weeks after first application.
- Avoid lawn stress by cutting no more than 1/3 grass height. Proper feeding, watering & mowing will control disease better than chemicals.
