FALL GARDENING TIPS

- Deadhead all roses to make them re-bloom or cut them back 1/3.
- Keep blooms cut from basil to keep it strong and going longer.
- Plant cilantro, parsley, poppies, larkspur, dianthus, lobelia and chrysanthemums.
- Plant spinach, carrots and broccoli.
- Prune salvia, pentas and lantana and fertilize for a good fall show.
- Fertilize tomatoes when fruit is golf ball size.
- Treat St. Augustine grass with Terraclor or Daconil if brown patch has been a problem in the past.

HUMMINGBIRD TIPS

Make your own nectar by combining 1 part sugar, 4 parts water. Boil 1-2 minutes. No coloring is needed. Cool and store in the refrigerator. Your feeders need to be cleaned and nectar changed every 3-4 days. Never use harsh detergent to clean your feeder. Rinse with hot water and add a little bleach to prevent mold from growing in the feeder. Rinse thoroughly.

To attract hummers, place your feeder among flowers. Hummingbirds are very territorial and defend feeders within their favorite roost spot. Try not to put multiple feeders within sight of each other...perhaps on another side of your house.

A common misconception is the belief that if you do not take your feeder down they will not migrate. This is false! Sometimes one will stay behind for the winter because it is too weak to make the trip. Last winter, I had a hummer stay and eat every day. So, I keep my feeder up year-round.
