BUNCO HISTORY

As you may know, Point Aquarius has several Bunco groups that play monthly.

Bunco originated in the late 1800's as a gambling game played in saloons to swindle property owners out of their land. Luckily, it is now popular among women in the United States seeking to strengthen their social ties with friends and neighbors.

It was originally called 8-dice cloth and began in 18th century England. It was introduced in the San Francis area in 1855 by a gambler who made his way across North America during the gold rush.

After the Civil War, Bunco thrived as the economy recovered and the population grew. Nearly all the large cities in the US had Bunco games in operation between 1870-1880. All levels of society took to the parlor game-some located in plush, lavish surroundings and others in stark surroundings or offices.

A fun way to promote social interaction, Bunco flourished prior to World War I.

Bunco parlors existed during prohibition and the roaring 20s in the US. Detectives who raided these parlors were called the "Bunco Squads".

When prohibition ended, it spread to the suburbs.

In the early 1980's parties began to emerge all over the country. Women occupied with work, family and overly busy lifestyles were looking for something fun to do with friends and neighbors. Bunco has become a great alternative to back yard barbeques and plain old visits.
