Possum Facts

The average lifespan in the wild is 1-2 years. When threatened, these animals will "play possum".

Opossums are opportunistic omnivores that eat a wide variety of animal and plant matter. While they're mainly scavengers, feeding on dead animals and plant matter, they also love insects and occasionally hunt small animals like chicks and snakes.

They are nocturnal, active mainly after dark.

They give birth to two litters of 4-8 young (joeys) a year. The gestation period is about 13 days, after which time the joeys are born and must immediately claim one of the 13 nipples inside the mother's punch. They remain in the pouch for about 50 days, after which time they begin to exit and spend time on their mother's back.

Valentine's Day originated as a Western Christian feast day honoring one or two early saints named Valentinus. Valentine's Day is recognized as a significant cultural, religious, and commercial celebration of romance and romantic love in may regions around the world, although it is not a public holiday in any country. The day first became associated with romantic love with the circle of Geoffrey Chaucer in the 14th century. Ιt evolved into an occasion in which lovers expressed their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery, and sending greeting cards. Valentine's Day symbols that are used today include the heart-shaped outline, doves and the figure of the winged Cupid. Since the 19th century, handwritten valentines have given way to mass -produced greeting cards. In Europe, Saint Valentine's Keys are given to lovers "as a romantic symbol and an invitation to unlock the giver's heart?, as well as to children, in order to ward off epilepsy (called Saint Valentine's Malady).


