JULY 4 TRIVIA

- The Fourth of July was not declared a federal holiday until 1938.
- The first White House Forth of July party was held in 1804.
- John Adams and Thomas Jefferson died on July 4, 1826.
- The Declaration of Independence was a justification for a revolt against the British which included a list of charges against the British king.
- "Yankee Doodle", a popular American patriotic song, was originally sung prior to the Revolution by British military officers in mockery of the unorganized and buckskin-wearing "Yankees".
- The "Star Spangled Banner" was written by Francis Scott Key and was originally a poem stemming from his observations in 1814 concerning the British attack on Baltimore's Fort McHenry during the War of 1812. It was later put to music, though not decreed the official national anthem until 1931.
- An estimated 150 million hot dogs will be consumed on July 4th.
- The origin of Uncle Sam probably began in 1812, when Samuel Wilson was a meat packer who provided meat to the US Army.

BLUEBIRDS

We are lucky to have beautiful bluebirds in our area.

They are a great prospect for nest boxes if you have the space to put one up in your yard. They are particular about their nesting box. They like snug boxes with a 4-inch-square base and a 1 3/4-inch diameter entry hole.

The make bluebird displays at his nest cavity to attract a female. He brings nest material to the hold, goes in and out, and waves his wings while perched about it. That is pretty much his contribution to nest building; only the female builds the nest and incubates the eggs.

They typically have more than one successful brood per year. Young produced in early nests usually leave their parents in summer, but you from later nests frequently stay with their parents over the winter.

They eat mostly insects, wild fruit and berries.

The female lays four or five eggs at a time and incubate them for around two weeks.

The oldest recorded bluebird was at least 10 years, 6 months ole. It had been banded in New York in May, 1989, and was found dead in South Carolina November, 1999.
