## POINT AQUARIUS BALD EAGLES

Our resident bald eagles raised two offspring this year. They are getting to be very big and should be flying soon.

You can see them sitting near their nest on Corvus.

Bald eagles mate for life. They're found mainly in the United States and northern Mexico.

They eat fish mainly.

Bald eagles are not actually bald; the name derives from an older meaning of the word, "white headed". The adult is mainly brown with a white head and tail. The sexes are identical in plumage, but females are about 25 percent larger than males. The yellow beak is large and hooked. The plumage of the immature is brown.

They are sexually mature at 4-5 years of age. When they are old enough to breed, they often return to the area where they were born. Courtship involves elaborate, spectacular calls and flight displays by the males. The female lays 1-3 eggs. Both eagles take turns incubating the eggs. Incubation takes is about 35 days.
